St Mary's Church, Newick Parish Council, the village pastoral care team and many wonderful volunteers have been working closely together to support our community since the start of the outbreak of Covid-19. We have Newick Community Response (NCR) email [newickcommunityresponse@gmail.com](mailto:newickcommunityresponse@gmail.com) for Parishioners who need help and people able to offer help. The Facebook group 'Newick Community Response Covid 19 – Mutual Aid' is offering real time help for those who need it. We have had some glorious weather recently and residents who are undertaking their daily exercise have been discovering new walks and the beautiful countryside we are so lucky to live in. Newick Rootz is a volunteer group formed in 2011 under the guidance of the East Sussex County Council and with the support of the Newick Parish Council. Under normal circumstances the group is actively engaged in maintaining and improving public footpaths in the Parish. Whilst more people have been out and about this has resulted in an increase in litter. Sadly dog waste bags, gloves and masks have been found littered in the village.

When VE Day dawns on 8th May 2020 it will be 75 years since the guns fell silent at the end of the war in Europe. Many celebrations were planned for the weekend which have now been cancelled or postponed. They suggest a two-minute national silence at 11am. At 2.45pm the first of two special BBC One programmes will be shown to mark VE75, including extract from Sir Winston Churchill's victory speech delivered at 3pm on VE Day. In the afternoon Britons are encouraged to hold 1940s-style afternoon tea parties at home rather than street parties, including homemade bunting and recipes from the era. <https://ve-vjday75.gov.uk/plan-your-ve-day-party/> NEASSA are planning a fun family 'Virtual Village Quiz' to remember the armed services on VE75 Day, as well as recognising our Emergency Services and NHS at this time. It has been great to see people are supporting each other by sharing jigsaws games, wool etc. which makes such a difference, Patsy continues to be willing to help with the distribution if necessary.
